



The Zuse Z3 Computer










Bottom: Jean Jennings (left) and Frances Bilas, two of the ENIAC programmers, are preparing the computer for Demonstration Day in February 1946.



In 1958, he formed the Advance Research Projects Agency (ARPA). Its mission was to "prevent technological surprise."






